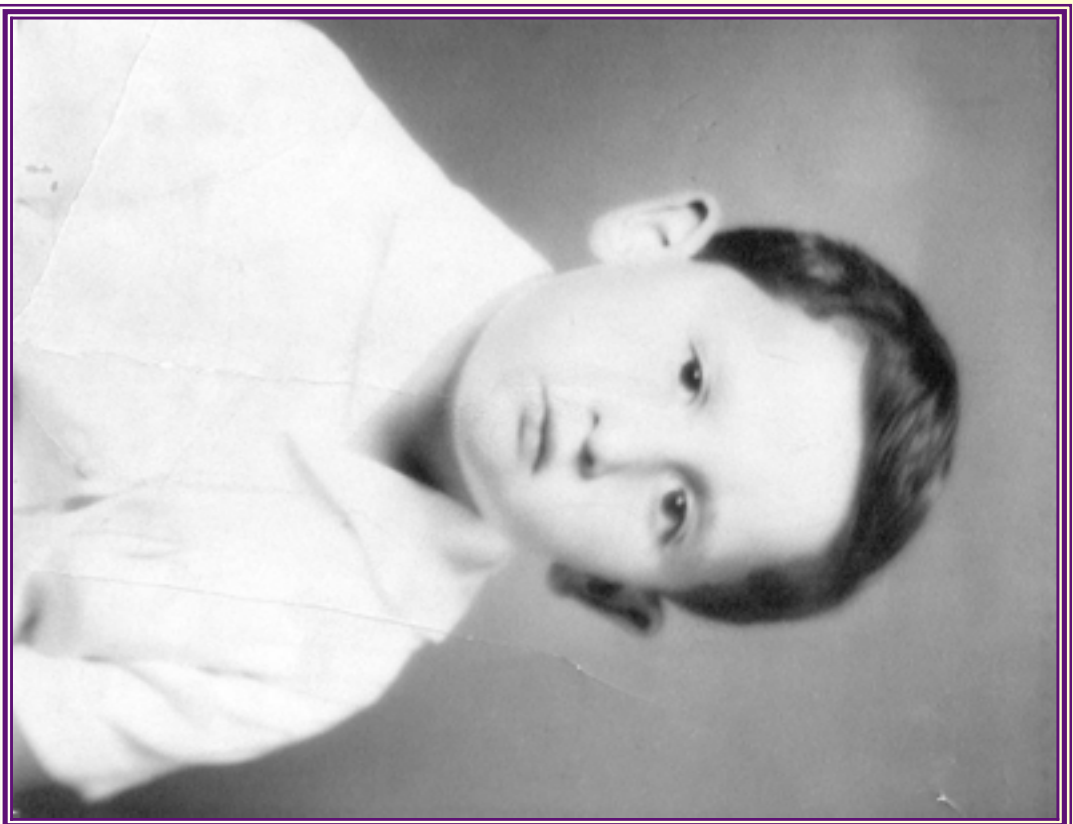

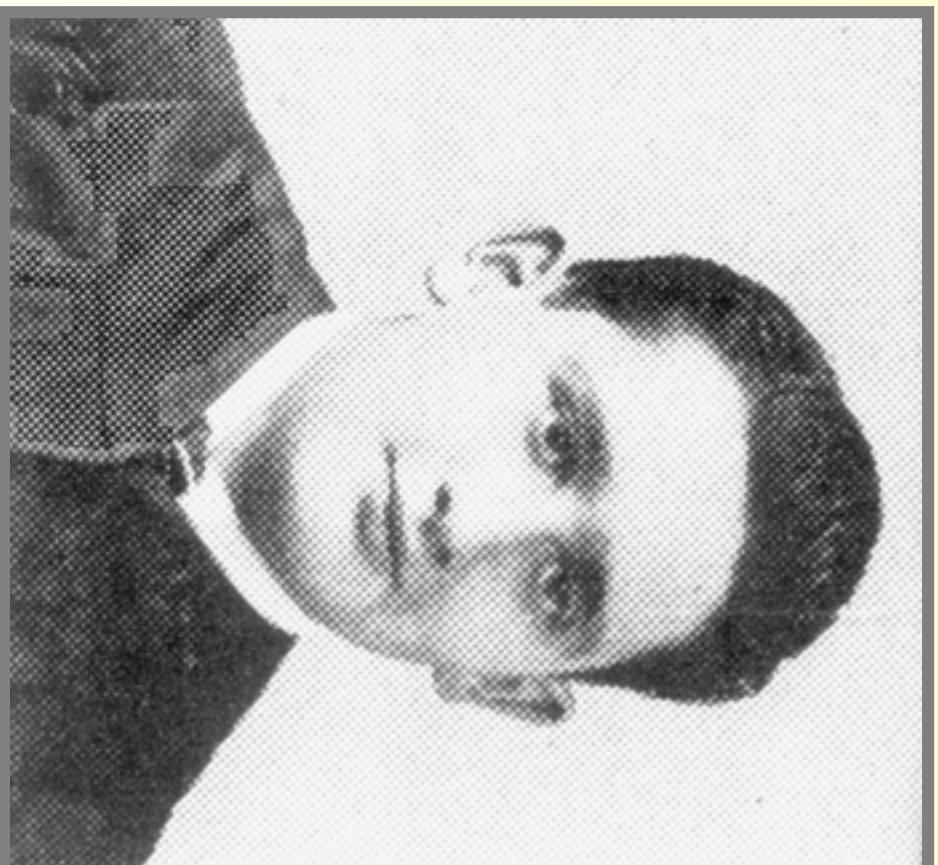

Mr. Schwartz joined the faculty last year after having spent the years since his graduation as an attorney in the Civil Division, United States Department of Justice. His present practice, though limited to occasional consultation, is in International Trade and Evidence. He earned his A.B. degree at Brooklyn College in 1952 and his LL.B. at Columbia in 1954. While in law school he was Research Editor of the *Law Review* and was a Stone Scholar. He is also a Phi Beta Kappa. Admitted to the New York Bar, the Texas Bar, and the bars of the U. S. Supreme Court and Courts of Appeals, he teaches Contracts, Evidence, and International Transactions.

Prof. Schwartz Appointed “Honorary East Texan”

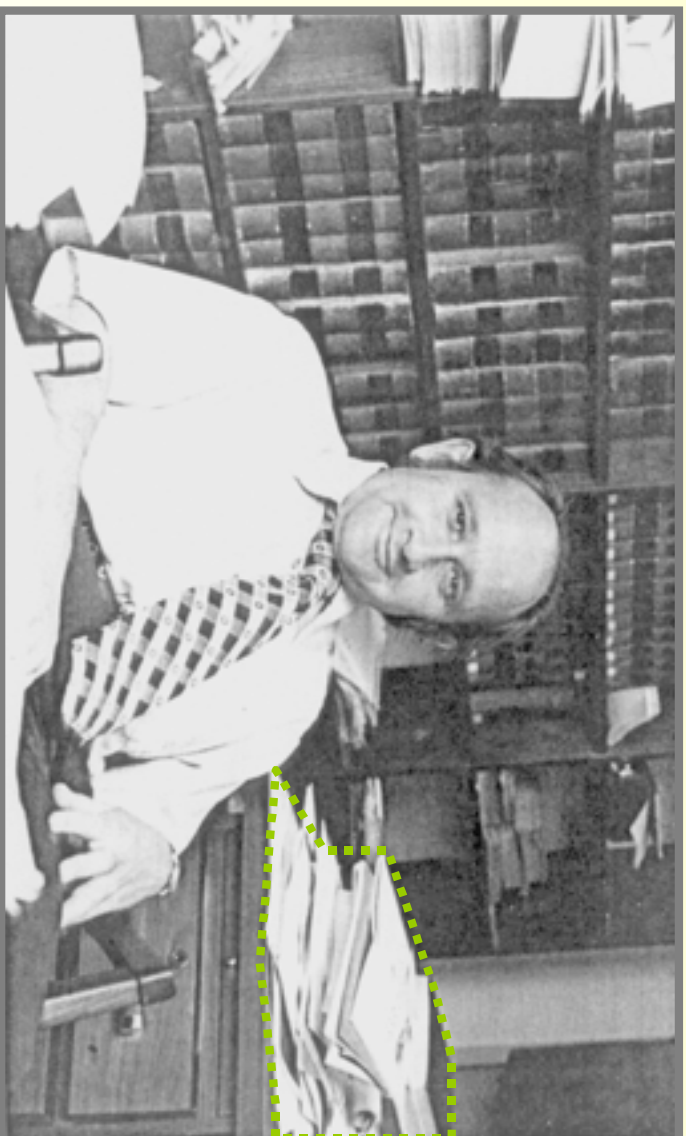
